The New Zealand Blood Service was established in 1998 to provide a national vein to vein service in transfusion. Both areas are responsible for collecting and processing voluntary blood donations as well as having active donor apheresis units and active therapeutic apheresis and venesection programmes.

Vacancies now exist for two part time (approximately 20 hours per week) Medical Officers, one in Waikato and one in Christchurch, to work with the Transfusion Specialist to ensure the clinical needs of donors and patients are met. As the successful candidate you will assist with the clinical oversight of the Donor Service, have a daily interaction with donors and those involved in collection. You will provide timely and effective advice concerning blood and apheresis collection sessions and ensure that efficient clinical follow up of laboratory tests of donations and donor blood samples occur.

To be successful in obtaining either of these roles, you will be a NZ Registered Medical Practitioner. Training will be provided for the successful applicant and accordingly prior experience in transfusion medicine is not a requirement. However, a background in hospital or general practice would be advantageous. For suitable applicants the experience gained in the role may be acceptable for advanced training for the RACP.
